(707) 444-3834 The Affordable Housing Programs (AHP) of the Federal Home Loan Banks (FHLBanks) FAMILY SERVICES are a critical source of affordable housing funds that have been accessed by the Redwood Transitional Living Program Community Action Agency (RCAA): 1. for discounted loans for the implementation of first (707) 269-9590 time homebuyer programs, 2. partially fund a 78 bed transitional housing program for Family Emergency Shelter homeless people and 3. for discounted loans to purchase a drop-in/outreach center serving (707) 269-2075 homeless youth. Other agencies in northwestern California have also received funds for first **FOOD STAMP** time homebuyer and multi-family housing developments.

(707) 443-6317 In all cases the staffs at the FHLB of San Francisco have worked closely and effectively with HOUSING SERVICES the RCAA and local member banks to meet the intent of the AHP program and address (707) 269-2033 pressing local human needs for housing and supportive services. Another community

Housing Rehabilitation benefit of the AHP is the involvement of member banks with AHP supported projects. Grant Administration This not only provides CRA credit to the member bank, but promotes their active Program Consulting
Wheelchair Ramp Program involvement and understanding local housing needs and often results in a bank's increased (707) 269-2031 lending (e.g. 1st mortgage loans to first time homebuyers) and philanthropic activity locally.

SERVICES It is RCAA's understanding that the proposed rule, with its requirement to increase retained (707) 269-2057 or 269-2065 earnings by \$562 million and thereby decrease the dividends available to members, is likely Planning & Implementation to make membership in the Bank less attractive for some current members. The proposed Restoration/Mitigation rule would require the combined FHLBanks to increase retained earnings by over \$3 billion, Ecosystem Management Training according to a Bank estimate. Some members, particularly larger ones, may choose to Landscape Contractor License #518874 borrow less and, therefore, reduce the profitability of the Bank, and consequently the net earnings that support the AHP.

(707) 269-2052 While RCAA is not a financial institution nor are its staff fully informed about FHLB laws and regulations; we do understand that if the FHLB's AHP and related programs have fewer PROPERTY MANAGEMENT dollars to invest in affordable housing, less housing will be produced for low and very low income households. California has just experienced another period of rapidly rising single **VISTA PROJECT** family housing prices that has been paralleled by increasing rents.

The Redwood Community Action Agency urges you to withdraw this proposed rule. If my understanding of the rule's impact on AHP activities is alarmist from your perspective, (707) 443-8322 Ext 201 please provide information to me indicating the neutrality or beneficial aspects of it.
