We understand that in 2010 the Federal Housing Finance Authority prepared a statement that eliminated the use of the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) loan program. We strongly support the City of Palm Desert and their continued use of PACE loans. The PACE loan program is a vital tool for local governments in their efforts to encourage energy independence and environmental sustainability.

The PACE program is entirely voluntary and is used by property owners in communities nationwide to finance renewable energy and water efficiency projects for their homes and commercial buildings. The improvement saves utility costs and stays with the property if the property owner moves and so does the assessment. The utility cost savings are projected to exceed the assessment payments. The City of Palm Desert was the first to utilize these energy-efficiency loans. As a result, they have reduced energy usage by 2.5 million kWh annually since 2008 and removed more than 1,724 metric tons of carbon dioxide from the air.

These loans are essential as PACE financing provides significant public benefits while making use of traditional assessment financing. We encourage the FHFA to not eliminate the PACE program and to listen to the local governments that have been utilizing the program with such great success. We also understand that the City of Palm Desert is willing to discuss any questions or concerns we may have relating to the program.

Again, we are pleased to support the City of Palm Desert and the PACE loan program.
